Guests: Mayor Greg Fraunfelter, Safety-Service Director Bruce Walker, Auditor Chris Robers, Treasurer Jen Fickel, and Law Director Abby Saving. Code Enforcement Officer Joe Posey and Ron McQuaide also appeared.

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by President Fred Hawk at 7:01 P.M. The Pledge of Allegiance and prayer were led by Jim Robinson.

Roll Call: Present – Mike Berry, Shirley Chapman, Dave Driscoll, Judie Henniger, James Martin, Jim Robinson, and Ed Tucker.

Approval of Proceedings: Chapman made a motion to approve the December 10, 2019 minutes as submitted which was seconded by Henniger. After a voice vote the motion unanimously passed.

Reports:

<u>Mayor</u> – Fraunfelter provided a flyer to new council members regarding Newly Elected Council Training sessions available in the future. He then informed council he had submitted a budget request for \$2,000,000.00 to the state for downtown improvements and he is optimistic it will be approved. He mentioned another grant that

had been denied, but he was hiring a grant writer to apply once again (the third effort), hoping for a more successful outcome. January 30, 2020 will be the city employee recognition dinner, at which time the State of the City address will be presented. Chapman inquired if the city had been granted the gas tax money for which they had applied and he responded, "Yes; \$15,000.00 per month". This news had a positive effect on all council members.

<u>Safety-Service Director</u> – Walker indicated the water treatment plant project was still on schedule, the water line installation is continuing to progress and the new pool construction is moving now that the contaminated dirt in the vicinity has been removed.

<u>Law Director</u> – Saving introduced the new Logan code enforcement officer, Joe Posey, who provided an informative power point demonstrating the myriad of problems nuisance properties create for the entire city. Photographs convincingly demonstrated safety concerns impacting First Responders entering burning abandoned properties. Saving, Posey, and Police Chief Mellinger have been meeting on a weekly basis to scrutinize the current city code (which was last updated in 1990), exploring ways to bring it up to date. Saving recommended the creation of an ad hoc "code enforcement committee" that would view the work they have done and make recommendations back to council. Jim Robinson volunteered to serve as the committee chairman. Dave Driscoll, Judie Henniger and James Martin also

volunteered. A meeting has been set for Thursday January 23, 2020 at 9 a.m. in Saving's law office for the committee to meet with those currently working on the issue.

<u>City Auditor</u> – Robers submitted the December 2019 Auditor's Report to Council. Robinson made a motion to accept the report as submitted which was seconded by Driscoll. The motion unanimously carried.

<u>City Treasurer</u> – Fickel submitted to Council the December 2019 Treasurer's Report, her 2019 annual report and two amended reports from earlier in the year. Robinson made a motion to accept the reports as submitted which was seconded by Driscoll. The motion unanimously carried. Fickel also announced that Meeder Investments will be here for a 9:30 a.m. meeting on January 27, 2020 to provide an opportunity for council members to ask questions and acquire more information to determine if council would like to utilize their services for the city.

<u>Finance</u> – Robinson submitted the minutes for the December 16, 2019 Committee meeting. A combined meeting of the Finance and Water and Sewer Committees has been set for Monday, January 20, 2019 at 10:15 in the Council Chambers.
